IMPACT ANALYSIS of P.E. and SCHOOL SPORTS PREMIUM

The Government is providing each primary school in the country £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil per annum for the academic years 2013/2014, 2014/2015, 2015/2016 & 2016/2017. The money is ring fenced and available for headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Our school received **£8885** for the period to 31st March 2017.
